In April, we welcome Dr Brigitte Balanda, during her studies at UCL Brigitte Balanda had the opportunity to participate in one season of the Merowe Dam Archaeological Salvage Project at the 4th cataract of the Nile. A visit to the nearby Napatan royal cemeteries at Nuri and el-Kurru sparked her interest in the archaeology of ancient Nubia and especially in the cultural exchange between Egypt and Nubia which eventually led to the rise of the Kingdoms of Napata and Meroe. The 'Development of Royal Funerary Traditions along the Middle Nile Valley during the Napatan Period' became the focus of her thesis, for which she was awarded her PhD in 2013.
